Annual Immigrant Action Day Focuses on Immigration, Health Care and Census February 22, 2010

On Saturday, CAUSA, Oregon's Immigrant Rights Coalition, held it's 12th annual Immigrant Action Day in Salem. The event took place at Chemeketa Community College and drew close to 375 people (300 adults and 75 children) including delegations from Medford, Bend, Woodburn, Salem and Newberg.



The topics covered included Comprehensive Immigration Reform, Health Care Reform and the 2010 Census. Around Immigration Reform, speakers discussed two crucial pieces of legislation, Comprehensive Immigration Reform for America's Security and Prosperity (CIR-ASAP) Act of 2009 and the Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors (DREAM) Act of 2009, and advocacy efforts to pass them in Congress this year.



Those in attendance on Saturday were very positive showing great optimism and hope for the future.

This year's event brought a series of firsts, including a new strategic alliance between CAUSA and the Latino Health Care Coalition and an alliance among Club Juntos, Chemeketa Multicultural Center and CAUSA.

Speakers included Kim Bobo, Executive Director of Centro Interfaith Worker Justice, Attorney Barbara Ghio, Edith Molina of the Latino Health Care Coalition and Gladys Romero with the 2010 Census, among others. A complete list of speakers can be found
